For many, doing a PhD in a foreign country is an important element of their academic education. Moreover, it is a chance to develop personal, social, and cross-cultural competence. To benefit from a stay abroad in an optimal way, it is expedient and useful to explore one's own cultural identity, feelings of foreignness as well as distinctive features of the host culture.

International PhD students of all research institutions in Halle are invited to participate in this Englishspeaking workshop. On the basis of simulations from cross-cultural trainings along with moderated peer consulting, participants will have the opportunity to exchange their impressions and perceptions as well as aims and expectations with regard to their stay abroad. The seminar also affords the opportunity to discuss first-hand experience with cross-cultural misunderstandings and interpersonal conflict situations and to simulate possible approaches in dealing with them. In addition, it wants to address distinctive characteristics of the scientific landscape in the city of Halle.

Located in the immediate vicinity of Weimar's city center, the conference site offers a beautiful scenery and is a great vantage point for exploring the area during an organized city tour or for visiting the places of cultural interest in the evening.

As this two-day workshop is highly interactive, participants' contributions in discussions, exercises, and role plays will be required and very welcome! The units will build upon one another.

Terms of participation

1) Registration and number of participants

Registrations are binding!

Registrations can only be submitted using the registration form via regular mail, fax, or email. Upon registration, you will receive a confirmation with the request to pay the participation fee (15 Euro) either in cash or via money transfer.

The number of participants is limited. Registrations are considered upon receipt. We reserve the right to cancel the seminar due to a low number of participants or unexpected reasons on short notice. There will be an immediate notification. As far as possible, we will offer an alternate date.

2) Participation fee and general expenses

The overall costs amount to 80 Euro per person. The participation fee is 15 Euro. Expenses for room and board will be covered by the International Office. Individual travel costs cannot be reimbursed but it is possible to take part in the paid group journey.

3) Deregistration / Cancelation

In case of deregistration or cancelation by the PhD student, we charge a general processing fee according to the following scale:

more than 2 weeks before the seminar starts: full refund of the participation fee (15 Euro) up to 2 weeks before the seminar starts - 33% refund of the participation fee (5 Euro) up to one week before the seminar starts - 50% of the overall costs (40 Euro) or nomination of a substitute participant

up to 3 days before the seminar starts or in default of appearance – full seminar expenses (80 Euro)

4) Data privacy protection

Upon registration for the seminar, the PhD student agrees to the processing of his or her data as far as this is necessary within the terms of the organization of the seminar. According to the Federal Data Protection Act, personal data are handled strictly confidential and are not passed on to third parties.
